Seek the Lord and live, or he will break out against the house of Joseph like fire, and it will devour Bethel, with no one to quench it. Ah, you that turn justice to wormwood, and bring righteousness to the ground! ... They hate the one who reproves in the gate, and they abhor the one who speaks the truth. Therefore because you trample on the poor and take from them levies of grain, you have built houses of hewn stone, but you shall not live in them; you have planted pleasant vineyards, but you shall not drink their wine. Jesus looked at them and said, "For mortals it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible." Peter began to say to him, "Look, we have left everything and followed you." Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields, for my sake and for the sake of the good news, who will not receive a hundredfold now in this age—houses, brothers and sisters, mothers and children, and fields, with persecutions—and in the age to come eternal life. But many who are first will be last, and the last will be first."

LUTHERAN DISASTER RESPONSE
HURRICANE MICHAEL

OCTOBER 2018

The 2018 hurricane season continues to produce strong storms with potentially devastating impacts to the United States.

The latest storm, Hurricane Michael, is threatening our neighbors on the Gulf Coast with dangerous winds, heavy rainfall and storm surge. Evacuation orders and warnings are in effect across many areas, and emergencies have already been declared in Florida, Georgia and Alabama. The storm make landfall with winds upward of 150 miles per hour.

Lutheran Disaster Response is monitoring Hurricane Michael as it develops and is coordinating its response with Lutheran
